This is regarding my interest in affiliating with a Roma rights NGO in Italy. I am applying for a grant that would allow me to document how music can be a force for cultural change and a global force for mutual understanding. The one-year project would focus on creating and performing a musical/theatrical production with college-aged Italian students that addresses issues and prejudices that Roma young people face with the goal of increasing understanding between Roma communities and their Italian neighbors. I am currently in contact with several universities that are considering affiliating with me on the project. My reason for contacting you is to ask if you know of a Roma rights NGO that would be interested in affiliating with me on this project? I believe that the project can help Italian university students to have a greater understanding of the issues that Roma youth are facing today. This increased awareness can help to decrease stereotyping, discrimination, and misunderstanding between the two communities.

I would also like to share with you my personal and professional experience in music and working cross culturally. In July 2012 I traveled to France as the Musical Director and a performer in La Caroline, an original rock opera, which was performed by college students from the University of North Florida in Jacksonville, Florida. This production documented the French settlement of Florida and the impact this had on the indigenous Native American population. During Summer 2012 I also traveled for two weeks in Italy and witnessed the difficulties that the Roma communities are experiencing, giving me the idea for this project. I have been performing as a professional musician/songwriter for 15 years and have traveled and performed in musical productions in Brazil, Argentina, Chile, Hong Kong/China and have also traveled in the Middle East and Europe. My education includes a Bachelor's degree in Multicultural Studies, a Master's degree in Counseling Psychology, and I am currently finishing a Bachelor's degree in Jazz Music Studies at the University of North Florida.
